A BILL

To repeal the provision of law that provides automatic pay
adjustments for Members of Congress.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ELIMINATION OF AUTOMATIC PAY ADJUST-**
4 **MENTS FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (2) of section 601(a)
6 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C.
7 31) is repealed.

1 (b) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

2 Section 601(a)(1) of such Act is amended—

3 (1) by striking “(a)(1)” and inserting “(a)”;

4 (2) by redesignating subparagraphs (A), (B),

5 and (C) as paragraphs (1), (2), and (3), respectively;

6 and

7 (3) by striking “as adjusted by paragraph (2)

8 of this subsection” and inserting “as from time to

9 time adjusted by law”.

10 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect

11 on December 31, 2014.

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
