Mr. COLE (for himself, Mr. MULLIN, Mr. LONG, and Mr. LATTA) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To make improvements to the Children’s Gasoline Burn
Prevention Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT TO THE CHILDREN’S GASOLINE**
4 **BURN PREVENTION ACT.**

5 Section 2 of the Children’s Gasoline Burn Prevention
6 Act (Public Law 110–278; 122 Stat. 2602) is amended—

7 (1) in the heading, by striking “**CHILD-RE-**
8 **SISTANT PORTABLE GASOLINE CONTAINERS**”

9 and inserting “**PORTABLE FUEL CONTAINER**
10 **STANDARDS**”;

1 (2) by striking subsection (b) and inserting the
2 following new subsection:

3 “(b) REQUIREMENTS.—Effective 6 months after the
4 date of enactment of this Act, each portable fuel container
5 manufactured on or after that date for sale in the United
6 States shall conform to the provisions of ASTM standards
7 F852–08, F2517–09, F839–83 (2006), F976–08, F926–
8 02 (2007), as they are by their terms applicable to gaso-
9 line, kerosene, or diesel portable fuel containers, as issued
10 by ASTM International.”;

11 (3) in subsection (c), by striking “gasoline”
12 each place that it appears; and

13 (4) in subsection (d), by striking “child resist-
14 ance requirements of ASTM F2517–05” and insert-
15 ing “provisions of any standard described in sub-
16 section (b),”.

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
